Goldsbrough

The Bloodsworth House, located at 502 ~~Goldsbrough~~ Avenue, Cambridge, Dorchester County, MD is not located in an historic district, nor is it considered eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Bloodsworth house is a 1-1/2 story house built in 1940. The frame structure sits on a concrete block base and is covered with a gable roof, and aluminum siding. The colonial revival style porch has also been enclosed and screened.

The dwelling is typical of domestic architecture of the period and lacks the architectural distinctiveness to qualify for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C. The property is not known to have any associations with persons or events significant to our past and is thus not eligible under Criteria B or A.




