


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EAST NEW MARKET FEMALE SEMINARY


1 1/2 story (?) rectangular with gabled roof. Asphalt tile roof. Original frame structure is covered with plywood and other newer materials. Boxed in eaves.

Copied from BETWEEN THE NANTICOKE AND THE CHOPTANK:

"This frame building, now used as a storage barn, once played an important role in the educational history of East New Market; it was the town's only school for girls. In 1853 the East New Market Female Seminary opened for business, charging "eight dollars a term for board, wash included, lights--fifty cents extra and music instruction five dollars additional." It advertised that its teachers "propose(d) making it a school of the very first grade offering equal advantages to any of the higher female Board Schools or Colleges."
