The 700 block of Douglas would be considered eligible for the Cambridge Historic District, but the 600 block, in which this property is located, was left out of the eligible historic districts in Cambridge. The building at 615 Douglas is a two story gabled-roof home with asbestos siding and enclosed front porch. It's architectural style, although it might be considered a contributing resource if it were located within an identified district, lacks distinction and is not eligible for individual nomination.




