Based on the available information, 1607 Denekas Road does not appear to meet the National Register Criteria for individual listing. The two story, four bay, frame house is somewhat of interest for its heavy cornice and for the double front doors, however, it does not appear to possess sufficient architectural significance to warrant listing under Criterion C. The heavy cornice appears to have been a fairly common design feature in this area, located in extreme southern Dorchester County in the last quarter of the 19th century and perhaps into the early 20th century. On some other less modest houses, it is used with corner pilasters, suggesting a Greek Revival influence. The double door also appears to be a local building tradition and is found on a wide variety of house types dating from the 19th and 20th centuries. The house is not known to have been associated with any significant events or people. The house is located in the small watermen's community of Crocheron. However, the community is spread out over a large area with a number of noncontributing resources interspersed and does not appear likely to meet the National Register Criteria for listing as an historic district.


