The Anna Lee Moxey house is a two-story, three-bay frame house that stands on the north side of Railroad Avenue in the center of East New Market, Dorchester County, Maryland. The house faces south with the gable oriented on an east/west axis.

Built around 1870, the two-story, three-bay frame dwelling is supported by a minimal brick foundation and sheathed with asbestos shingles. The steeply pitched gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the back of the house is a single-story one-room plan kitchen.

The south (main) facade is an asymmetrical three-bay elevation with an off-center entrance and flanking six-over-six sash windows. The heavily molded Victorian door is topped by a three-light transom and flanked by long shutters. The windows to each side are flanked by shutters as well. Stretching across the front of the house is a shed-roofed porch with tapered posts. The porch floor has been laid in concrete. Lighting the second floor are three unevenly spaced six-over-six sash windows with louvered shutters. The cornice above is boxed and trimmed with bed and crown moldings.

The gable ends are pierced by six-over-six sash windows on each floor and small two-over-two windows light the attic to either side of interior end brick stacks. The gable end is flush and trimmed with a molded bargeboard.

The north side of the front block is partially covered by a single-story one-room plan kitchen wing. An interior end brick stack rises through the gable. A single-story one-room infill has been added to the inside corner of the ell-shaped house, and a shed-roofed eave stretches across the east side to shelter the side entrance.




2½ story, L-shaped frame structure covered with asbestos siding. Gabled, asphalt tile roof. An inside chimney at each of the 2 gables. Front facade is 3 bays wide, entrance in center, 2 bays deep. Original front door, refurbished to its original wood, has 4 recessed panels and at the top the 2 are arched. Above is a 3 horizontal light transom. Very narrow door surround.

There is a veranda supported by 4 boxed columns. Ceiling is tongue and groove with a cement and brick floor. Original louvered shutters at windows. Windows are 6 over 6. There is a wide frieze with narrow molding that extends around corner to gabled end on either side of the building at the frieze line. Original panes in some of the windows. In ½ story, original 2 over 2 windows with pegs.

In 1½ story rear section there was an overhanging porch that was removed. A decorative trim, based on original design, has been installed. Around door in rear section are 2 vertical 2 over 2 side lights, double hung. In the back there was a chimney which has been removed. Two stationery 4-pane windows in gable in rear section. A new bathroom addition in the L. Brick foundation.

This building is earlier than it looks.




