


PROPERTY OF MR. & MRS. CLIFFORD BLOODSWORTH

2½ story frame structure covered with aluminum siding. Jerkinhead (asphalt tile) roof; T-shaped with a front projection. 4-bay front. The main entrance is located in the 1st bay in the main block. Front facade has a first story bay above which is a square projection with a single window. 1st story windows 2 over 1; 2nd story 2 over 2 Replaced entrance porch. Entrance door is wooden with single light and horizontal panels (looks to be original to the building). Gabled end of roof has diamond-shaped wooden shingles with 2 small stationery windows. Jerkinhead gable on both sides, identical to front. Right side has a square bay which was probably added in the 20's or 30's because of the size of the windows. Left is 4-bay deep. One-story kitchen addition in rear. Right side of building extends forward of main block. Chimney in center of gable on rear and one on right side of the main block with corbels. Boxed cornices with returns; replaced aluminum shutters; brick foundation. Attractively landscaped. Has original? brick walk.

The Bloodsworth House

Land previously part of the Major Fletcher estate, which was divided into lots by his trustees. The front lot, #3 was purchased by Stewart Maxwell from William M. Fletcher and wife on Oct. 22, 1897 DLR CL21/736

House described as "Not finished but occupied" in tax records for 1898.

Back lot, #56, conveyed to Martha J. Maxwell (must be a daughter of Stewart, whose wife was Hattie) by the Fletchers on Jan. 7, 1903 CL 28/562

Stewart and Hattie had already conveyed the house to Martha J. Maxwell - CL 26 /180 Nov. 4, 1901

House built by Stewart Maxwell, 1898.
