DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>Hayland is a three-part telescopic-type house, but the tallest portion is narrower than the middle section. The tall portion is a three bay long, two story frame structure built on brick piers. The central portion is a one and one-half story, three bay long section and the kitchen wing is two bays long.</p> <p>Apparently, the middle section and kitchen pre-date the tall portion, which seems to be mid-nineteenth century. The other appears to be early nineteenth century. It presently has a long shed dormer across the facade which was added by the present owner. Originally there were two dormers on that side of the "A" roof, as there are on the other. Two chimneys were located on the gable adjoining the later wing, but one has been removed.</p> <p>The kitchen wing is lower and narrower than the middle section. It lacks a chimney, but undoubtedly had one on the south gable.</p> <p>Originally, the central portion, which now consists of a stair hall and two rooms, had a stair rising from the center of the west side of the house. It would have been enclosed and adjacent a board partition, which was all removed about the time of the addition of the north wing. So, the floor plan consisted of either three or four rooms, but this has not been absolutely determined. Of interest too, is the vestibule room in the kitchen wing which opens into a small store room and the kitchen proper. This feature resembles the plan at Robert and Patricia Young's house on Town Point.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The house is very fine example of the telescopic type and has an unusual floor plan as well as the fact that the central portion is two rooms deep. Few Dorchester County houses boast such a plan.

In the deed to the property several tracts of land are mentioned including: Manning's Marsh, Collins Intent, Feddeman's Purchase, and Mary's Friendship. Around the time the house was built, in the early 19th century, it was owned by Henry Manadier Steele who married Maria Key about 1800.
