

The Doubs Methodist Parsonage is a two and one-half story Carpenter Gothic cross gable residence with one story verandah with beveled columns and scrolled brackets which extend across the front of the building.

The Doubs Methodist Parsonage was built on land donated by William Smith, a local entrepreneur according to church records. The church originally named Smith's Chapel was incorporated on September 15, 1879.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Doubs Methodist Parsonage is a two and one-half story Carpenter Gothic frame gable roofed residence which faces west from the east side of Doubs Road in Doubs.

The principle facade is three bays wide. The main entrance, a replaced door with arched single light transom, and two side lights is located in the second bay.

Arched 2/2 windows with louvered shutters occupy the remaining two bays on the first and second level. A replaced 2/2 window with arched opening is located in the center of the front gable. A decorative pierced wood finial is mounted at the top of the center gable.

A one story verandah with beveled columns and scrolled brackets extends across the front of the building.

A two story frame addition extends to the rear of the residence with a two story open porch which faces the south.

The entire structure has been covered with asbestos siding and sits on a low random stone foundation. The center and flank gable roof is standing seam tin and is attached to the main structure by a boxed cornice with return. A single corbeled brick chimney straddles the south and east addition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Doubs Methodist Parsonage was built on land donated by William Smith, a local entrepreneur according to church records. The church originally named Smith's Chapel was incorporated on September 15, 1879. The following entry was made concerning the church.

"The members of the Smith's Chapel Congregation Buckeystown Circuit, Methodist Episcopal Church did in pursuance of a notice given on the preceding Sabbath by the Reverend Reuben Kolb, preacher in charge of . . . Smith's Chapel Congregation assemble at the Calico Rocks Public School House being the place ordinarily used for the meetings of said congregation and did then elect George W. Copeland, James D. Hood, Charles W. Myers and William Smith who . . . with the minister shall act as trustees . . ."1

The exact building date of the parsonage is unknown however it is still being used for that purpose today.


