The current assessment was prepared on behalf of Duke Energy North America as part of cultural resources investigations to support the proposed construction of a power plant in southern Frederick County near Point of Rocks (Goodwin 2001).

This property was surveyed initially in 1982 (Weissman 1982). In 1982, a two-story house was recorded. During a survey conducted in May 2001, no extant built resources were located on this property. Since no built resources remain extant on this property, there are no buildings that possess the qualities of significance for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.




