The J. S. Page House is an ell shaped two and one-half story coursed grey stone residence. It is the oldest structure in Adamstown certainly having been built on this site when it was still part of Carrollton Manor.

The residence exhibits a type of grey stone unique to the Adamstown and Buckeystown areas of Frederick County. The stonework is finely executed being cut and coursed with fine mortar joints.

The building is the only stone structure located in Adamstown which is dominated by late nineteenth century frame architecture.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The J.S. Page House is an ell shaped gable roofed coursed random stone structure which faces east from the west side of New Design Road in Adamstown. The principle facade is three bays wide. The main entrance, a replaced door is located in the second bay. The entrance way is a recessed paneled doorway with five light transom and three side light with large wood lintel and dentil work. Occupying the remaining bays on the first level are double hung 1/1 windows with large wood dentiled lintels and louvered shutters.

Occupying all three bays on the second level are double hung 6/6 windows with identical lintel and shutter treatment to the first level.

A three bay wide original addition extends to the rear of the building on the west side of the building. A window with lintel and shutters identical to those on the second level on the east side is located in each bay of the addition.

The entire structure is built on coursed random stone foundation. The flank gable roof is covered with patterned slate. A replaced brick corbeled chimney straddles the gable on the north and south ends. Two more chimneys are located on the addition to the rear.


