The Lime Kiln site is a large coursed stone structure approximately two stories high with one squared corner with stone quoins and five arched lime kilns approximately six feet deep and four feet high.

Lime used for both building, in mortar and plaster, and agriculture was obtained from limestone by calcining the stone, heating it to a very high temperature for a sustained period of time.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lime Kiln site, similar to many in the Frederick area is a large coursed random stone structure approximately two stories high with one squared corner with stone quoins and five arched lime kilns approximately six feet deep and four feet high.

Each kiln is an arched segmented stone opening with brick hearth and two foot by three foot oven opening.

The structure is completely covered with dirt and overgrowth on the north side and is hardly visible from Manor Woods Road.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Limestone was as early as the eighteenth century and continues to be a very important natural product found in the vicinity of Buckeystown.

Lime used for both, building in mortar and plaster and agriculture was obtained from the stone by calcining the stone which is heating it to a very high temperature for a sustained period of time in order to disperse any impurities and deriving the pure lime.


