The Daniel Baker House is a large ell shaped whitewashed brick residence laid in common bond which sits on a hill in the center of Buckeystown. The residence was the home of the Baker family, one of the most influential families in the development of Buckeystown.

The interior of the building is a center hall floor plan with decorative Victorian staircase flanked by two rooms on either side. Marble fireplaces compliment the front rooms on the first level. The rear section of the building is the oldest part of the structure as indicated by the cellar and earlier foundation.

The main residence was probably built soon after 1866 when Daniel Baker purchased 162 acres from John Sifford. The brick outbuildings are constructed from bricks burned at the Thomas/Baker brickyards which also existed on the property in the first part of the twentieth century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Daniel Baker House is a large ell shaped two story brick house laid in common bond which sits on a hill facing west from the east side of Route 85 in Buckeystown. The residence was the home of the Baker family, one of the most influential families in the development of Buckeystown. A four bay wide two story brick addition extends to the rear of the main block of the residence.

The principle facade is five bays wide and one room deep. The original arched paneled front door is located in the third bay. Occupying the remaining bays are replaced 1/1 windows.

Extending around the west and south sides of the building on the first level is a frame double columned porch with turned baluster railing. Two three bay windows project from the north side of the building. A two story open porch is located along the south side of the rear addition. The entire structure is built on a low random stone foundation and is covered by a replaced asphalt roof with boxed cornice and return.

The interior of the building is a center hall floor plan with decorative Victorian staircase flanked by two rooms on either side. Marble fireplaces compliment the front rooms on the first level. The rear section of the building is the oldest part of the structure as indicated by the cellar and earlier foundation.

In addition to the house are several brick outbuildings and a very large two story carriage house which has recently been restored. All constructed from bricks burnt by the adjacent Thomas brickyards.

The entire property is surrounded by a decorative cast iron and brick fence.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although a log structure, built in the 18th century stood north of the main residence until the 1930's and the rear addition to the main block appears to date from the same period in the cellar portion of the building, the main residence was probably not built until 1866. On September 19, 1866 Daniel Baker purchased 162 acres on the east side of the Buckeystown Pike from John Sifford for \$15,000.1

The land was used for a brick yards in the early part of the 20th century operated by his son, William. The brick outbuildings including a two story carriage house was built from bricks burned in this yard.


