The William Thomas House is a two story brick building laid in stretcher bond. The main entrance is twin paneled doors with single light transom.

A brick belt course surrounds the building at the base of the windows on the second level.

Extending from the north and south sides of the house is a two story brick three bayed window. One over one windows with decorative inset wood arches and triple header arches occupy each bay on the first level.

The building is covered by a slate hipped roof which takes on a pyramidal form to cover the bays on the north and south sides. A small eyelit window projects from the center front of the building.

The house was built in 1907 by Charles F. Thomas for his son, William. It was one of only two brick residences built during the Buckeystown building boom between 1890-1910.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The William Thomas House is a two story brick building laid in stretcher bond which faces east from the west side of Route 85 in Buckeystown.

The main entrance, twin paneled doors with single light transom, is located in the third bay. Occupying the remaining bays on the first level are double hung 1/1 windows with decorative inset wood arches. A five bay wide frame portico with round columns extends across the first level of the building. Plain one over one windows occupy each bay on the second level. A brick belt course surrounds the building at the base of the windows on the second level.

Extending from the north and south sides of the house is a two story brick three bayed window. One over one windows with decorative inset wood arches and triple header arches occupy each bay on the first level. Simple double hung one over one windows are located in each bay on the second level.

The building is covered by a slate hipped roof which takes on a pyramidal form to cover the bays on the north and south sides. A small eyelit window projects from the center front of the building. Two large decorative corbeled brick chimneys rise from the north and south center of the roof. The roof is attached by a boxed cornice with plain frieze.

The entire structure is built on a low brick foundation laid in stretcher bond. A three course wide stretcher brick water table surrounds the building above the foundation.

The interior of the residence is a center hall plan with two room flankers. The staircase is paneled with decorative egg and dart molding. Several arched marble mantelpieces with center keystone are located throughout the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The William Thomas House was built in 1907, soon after the land was sold to Charles F. Thomas by his wife, Sarah Thomas, for \$300.00.<sup>1</sup> Sarah had acquired the land from her father at his death. Charles F. Thomas built the house for his son, William. It was one of the only two brick residences built during the Buckeystown building boom between 1890-1910; the other being the John Delashmutt House.

The interior exhibits black marble mantelpieces and paneled staircase with egg and dart molding.

William Thomas lived in the house next to his father's, Charles F. Thomas (F-1-44) until 1921.<sup>2</sup>


