The William Boteler House is a two and a half story cross gable Carpenter Gothic residence. The main entrance is an arched paneled door with arched three light transom, side lights and scrolled brackets.

A very unusual pinwheel design vergeboard with connecting decorative vergeboard graces the front gable. A five bay wide frame porch with turned columns and scrolled brackets extends across the front of the residence. This porch once was decorated with pinwheel sawnwork similar to the decoration on the front and side gables.

The William Boteler House was built in 1907 and is typical of the Carpenter Gothic residences in Buckeystown.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The William Boteler House is a two and a half story flank and center gable roofed Carpenter Gothic frame residence which faces west from the east side of Route 85.

The principal facade is five bays wide. The main entrance, an arched paneled door with arch three light transom, side lights and scrolled brackets. Occupying the remaining bays on the first and second levels are 2/2 windows with arched louvered shutters. Located in the center gable is a Palladian window with segmentation identical to the Charles Huseman House. (F-1-56)

A very unusual pinwheel design vergeboard with connecting decorative bargeboard graces the front gable. A five bay wide frame porch with turned columns and scrolled brackets extends across the front of the residence. This porch once was decorated with pinwheel sawnwork similar to the decoration on the front and side gables.

The main block of the building is two bays deep with an original two story two bay wide frame addition extending to the northeast of the residence accommodating a two story open porch on the south side. Decorating the north and south gables are decorative pinwheel vergeboards. The patterned slate roof with fishscale shingling is connected to the residence by a plain boxed cornice with return and dentiled frieze. The entire residence is built on a low random stone foundation. Three single corbeled brick chimneys flank the gables on the north, south, and east sides.
