The Pleasant View Church is a simple rectangular frame one story church building, one bay wide and three bays deep with a belfry extension tower covered by a wood shingle pyramidal roof with a decorative finial. The church was built in 1910 on land which was part of lot number two of the grand division of Carrollton Manor, "for the purpose of building a house of Divine Worship for the use and benefit to the ministry and membership of the Methodist Episcopal Church."

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Pleasant View Church is a simple rectangular frame one story church building which faces south from the east side of Pleasant View Road. The building is one bay wide and three bays deep. A belfry extension tower is located in the southeast corner of the building. The entrance, twin four panel doors are located on the first level of the tower over which is a three light transom. A 6/6 window is located on the north side of the tower. The original bell sits inside a closed area on the top of the tower and is covered by a wood shingle pyramidal roof with a decorative finial

A large gothic window is located in the center of the east side of the building which is the principle facade of the building. Occupying the three bays on the north and south sides of the building are double hung 6/6 windows.

A one story frame addition has been added to the north side of the building. The entire structure is banked on a hill and built on a high random stone foundation. The front gable roof is constructed of standing seam tin with exposed rafters.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Pleasant View Methodist Episcopal Church was built in 1910 after the land was purchased for \$4.00 by the first trustees of the church, William Whalen Sr., John E. Frazier, Cyrus Rebusor, Lloyd F. Price, Lloyd Cromton, Joseph J. Thomas, John Dary, Patrick Ambush and Richard Harrison from Patrick Ambush and his wife on March 1, 1890. The land was part of lot #2 of the ground division of Carrollton Manor, "for the purpose of building a house of Divine Worship for the use and benefit to the ministry and membership of the Methodist Episcopal Church."¹


