The Herman Gosnell House was probably built circa 1860 by Amos Keller, who purchased the forty-seven perches of land upon which the house sits in 1860 for \$88.12 from David Jones.

The 1858 Bond Map of the town indicates a building occupied by A. L. Welling in its approximate location although, whether it is the same structure is unknown. The 1873 Titus Atlas indicated a house occupied by Mrs. Welling with a paint shop in the rear located in the vicinity.

In 1904, the Adams family purchased the house and owned it until 1944. These occupants were probably responsible for adding on the Victorian porch and other trim.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Herman Gosnell House is a small L-shaped two story frame residence which faces west from the east side of Route 85 in Buckeystown.

The principal facade is four bays wide. The main entrance, a replaced paneled and single pane door is located in the third bay. Occupying the remaining bays on the first level and three bays on the second level are 2/2 windows with flanking louvered shutters.

Aluminum awnings shelter the first and third bay on the second level.

A replaced porch with iron trim extends across the building on the first level.

The building which was originally covered with novelty siding has been sheathed in asphalt siding. A two story original frame additions extends to the rear of the building accommodating an open porch on the second level facing south which has been enclosed on the first level. A one story shed roof addition abuts against this addition.

The house which is constructed on a low random stone foundation is covered by a patterned slate flank gable roof with boxed cornice and return.

Two single corbeled brick chimneys rise from the north and south gable ends of the building.

The Weller Family owned the property until 1876 when it was sold to Jacob Baer.² At his death the property was sold to John Keyser.³ One year later, Keyser sold the property to Alice Trundle.⁴

In 1904, the Adams Family purchased the house and owned it until 1944.⁵ These occupants were probably responsible for adding on the Victorian porch and other trim.
