DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Nina Brown House is a small front gable Carpenter Gothic residence which faces north from the south side of Old Route 80 in Buckeystown.

The principal facade is two bays wide. The main entrance, a replaced paneled door with one light transom is located in the second bay. Occupying the remaining bay on the first level and both bays on the second level are original 2/2 double hung sashes covered with storm windows.

An original turned column porch with straight and dentiled railing extends across the front of the building on the first level.

The front gable is decorated by wood fishscale shingling. A small Palladian window is centered in the gable.

The entire residence, originally finished in German or novelty siding has been covered with asphalt shingling. The building is covered by a patterned slate roof with plain boxed cornice. The house is built on a low random stone foundation. One single brick extends from the southwest corner of the building.


