The Buckeystown School is one of three schools which were built in the town. The existing schoolhouse which was converted into a private residence in 1959 was built in 1878.

Daniel Baker purchased the three and one-third acres for \$515.00 on September 30, 1878 and sold the property two days later to the Board of County School Commissioners for \$275.00.

The building was used for a school until the 1950's when it was sold in 1959 for \$3,200.00. Although the old school has been used as a private residence for almost twenty years, it has retained much of its original architectural character.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Buckeystown School is a one story rectangular brick structure laid in common Bond which faces east from the west side of Route 85 in Buckeystown.

The principal facade is five bays wide. The main facade has been altered circa 1940 by the addition of a one story brick addition located between the original first and fifth bay.

Double hung 6/6 windows occupy each bay in the front addition. Originally all front windows were double hung 6/6 windows with large wood lintels.

A replaced door with covered original three light transom and wood lintel is located in the third bay. The brick addition abuts the original brick bell tower on the north and south ends where the door is located.

In referring to original photographs of the building, it reveals that the existing bell tower once rose two stories high with a hexagonal open frame belfry and spired slate roof.

The building is two bays deep. Two sets of five 6/6 windows extend along the entire rear of the building. A small single brick chimney rises between the two sets.

The entire building is constructed on a high random limestone foundation. It is covered by a standing seam flank gable roof with boxed cornice and return which replaces the original slate roof. Two brick chimneys which once flanked the north and south gables have been removed.

The building was converted into two apartments after it outlived its use as a school in 1958.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

The Buckeystown School is one of three schools which were built in the town.

According to Grove's History of Carrollton Manor, "the first schoolhouse at Buckeystown stood a few hundred yards from Rocky Fountain beside a Calimus (sic) patch near the old Quaker burying ground. It was built of logs and probably by Mr. Darnell as it was not far from his mansion. . . . (a) schoolhouse was built along the mill race on the road to Davis Mill . . . about 1840."<sup>1</sup>

The existing schoolhouse which was converted into a private residence in 1959 was built in 1878.


