DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lime Kiln Methodist Church is a one story one bay wide and three bay deep frame church with extension belfry which faces north from the south side of Lime Kiln Road in Lime Kiln.

The main entrance, twin three panel doors with decorative molding, triangular transom and bracketed pediments is located on the first level of the extension tower which is set out front of the main block of the building. A narrow double hung Gothic stained glass window is located on the east and west sides of the tower on the first level and on each side of the second level.

An open belfry with decorative sawn work, cast iron bell, and railing is located on the top of the tower. The pyramidal roof with decorative octagonal slate work and finial covers the tower.

The entire structure is built on a low random stone foundation. The building is covered with German siding with corner boards. Narrow stained glass six over six Gothic windows occupy each bay of the main chancel.

A small shed addition accommodating the interior alter extends from the rear of the building.

The front gable is covered by the original slate roof with boxed cornice, molded frieze and return.

A small brick chimney rises from the center of the east side of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Lime Kiln Methodist Church is the only church in the settlement of Lime Kiln although it is no longer functioning as a house of worship.

According to William Grove's History of Carrollton Manor, "the Methodist Protestant Church at Lime Kiln, was built in 1888; the first pastor was Reverend J. M. Sheridan; the present pastor was Rev. J. W. Kirk."¹ Although the building is vacant and being subjected to vandalism, the structure retains much of its historic architectural character.


