The Saint Mary's Church Social Hall is primarily significant to Petersville for its transitional architectural style and its use for functions by the Saint Mary's Church.

The building materials used in the building, German siding, patterned slate roof, and random stone foundation, dominate buildings in the late nineteenth century up until about 1915. However, the horizontal styling and floor to ceiling windows reflect a change from the ell shaped gabled roof Carpenter Gothic style to the Bungalow and Shingle style.

The building was also a center of activity in the twenties, thirties, and forties as a place for strawberry festivals and other church socials.


