Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*
Dating from 1924, the Jefferson Primary School is eligible for the National Register under Criterion C as an element lacking individual distinction within a potentially eligible historic district. The school can be characterized as a supporting building in the Jefferson Historic District because it represents 1) a public building located on the town's main street which played a locally important role in the history of public education in Jefferson and 2) a component of the collections of modest, vernacular buildings forming the district which conveys the historical development of a typical rural town in the Western Maryland region.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The main entrance located in the center of the north side of the building extends forward of the main block of the building. This entrance tower is constructed of smooth brick laid in common bond with a stepped parapet capped with cement at the top. A rectangle inset in the brick wall and bordered with header bricks is located over the arched opening. A stepped brick wall capped with cement flanks the main steps leading to the front entrance. The main entrance doors which had been twin four panel doors have been boarded close. The principal facade is three bays wide. The main entrance is located in the second bay.

Twin multipaned windows are located in each bay. A stretcher belt course encircles the entire building over the windows and just above the basement at the foundation level. Three diamond shaped brick patterns decorate the facade of the school over the upper belt course.

The rear elevation (south) of the building is identical to the front. Two sets of five multipaned windows light the classrooms on the east and west sides of the school which are identical except for a cellar entrance, a crossbuck door down a flight of cement stairs surrounded by pipe railing located in the center of the east side of the building.

The building is built on a high brick foundation and covered by what appears to be a flat composite roof with cement capped brick parapet.

Two single brick chimneys rise from the center west and southwest corners of the building. A one story cinder block shed is located in the southeast corner of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

"Pursuant to and in conformity with the provisions on an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the January Session, 1872 Chapter 377," the Board of School Commissioners for the Primary School District 17 purchased the land upon which the existing old school building stands for \$500.00 from Michael and Elizabeth Culler on November 9, 1896.¹

This was the second school to sit on the corner of Lander Road and Main Street. In 1841 the trustees of the Primary School #17 bought land for a school from Andrew and Loretta Kesler.²

The original school "consisted of two rooms, two privies located in the rear and a large town water pump out front." In 1858 a second floor was added to the building for use as a high school.³

In 1924 the existing school building which housed grades one through six was built and the old school razed.


