The Pleasant View Church of the Brethren is a frame one-story structure built in 1879 with later intersecting gable sections and a 1968 addition on the north. Built to serve the growing Brethren congregations in the Middletown valley, the church represents an expanding population in general in the last quarter of the 19th century. Architecturally, the current T-shape plan is similar to the meeting house type found in at least one other Brethren church building at Beaver Dam (F-8-106) near Johnsville. The cemetery east of the church has graves dating from 1822, indicating its use as a family cemetery 50 years prior to the building of the church.

## CONTRIBUTING RESOURCE COUNT: 1

The Pleasant View Church of the Brethren is a one-story frame meeting house type church built in 1879 with intersecting gable wings built in the early 20th century and a one-story 1968 addition located at the intersection of Picnic Woods Road and Burkittsville Road (Maryland Route 17) about two miles north of Burkittsville, Frederick County, Maryland. The original principal elevation faces south toward the road intersection and an iron fence surrounds both the church lot and the cemetery to the east.

The main section of the church has a T-shape plan with an intersecting gable facing south in which the original main entrance is located. The building is covered with aluminum siding and the roof is pressed metal. Aluminum also covers the door and window frames. The double doors in the original main entrance are 5-panels. The windows in the main section are stained glass in rectangular openings. A semi-circular window is located above the south doorway. The present main entrance is located in a projecting foyer on the east gable end of the church, facing toward the cemetery. It has plain textured glass in 1/1 narrow windows flanking the double 5-panel doors. The concrete block foundation of the foyer reveals the foyer to be an early 20th century addition. The 1968 addition on north side of the original church obscures the entire original elevation. The church is pictured in T.J.C. Williams and Folger McKinsey, History of Frederick County (1910), showing a rectangular gable-roofed frame building with four bays on the east elevation. The present T-shape plan apparently resulted from additions made to the structure in the last decade of the 19th century or the first quarter of the 20th century.

The cemetery contains graves dated as early as 1822, indicating the site was already in use as a cemetery for 50 years prior to the erection of the church.

The Pleasant View Church of the Brethren is a fair example of the rural meeting house type of church plan used in the late 19th century by many denominations. The form resulted from alterations over time which changed the original hall type plan to the present cross gable type. The church also represents the growing population of the Middletown Valley, which had Brethren churches north of Middletown at Harmony and Grossnickle Church, but none in the Burkittsville area until the building of Pleasant View Church.

The meeting house type represented by Pleasant View Church is comparable to the restored 1880's brick church at Beaver Dam Church of the Brethren (F-8-106). The similarity suggests a standard plan which may have been encouraged during the last quarter of the 19th century.

The Pleasant View Church resulted from a meeting of the Brethren Council held at Brownsville, Washington County, in 1878. At that time, Emanuel Slifer was authorized to appoint a building committee. Subscriptions for funds were circulated in the vicinity and the church lot and graveyard were purchased from Thomas Arnold. The early 19th century graves of the Arnold family suggest that the site was already a family cemetery when sold to the Brethren. The church was erected in late 1879 and dedicated on Jan. 1, 1880 (Williams and McKinsey, History of Frederick County, 1910).




