Demolished in 1978

The Yellow Springs Post Office and General Store was destroyed in 1978. The oldest section located on the south end of the building is a log structure with German joints, covered with beaded clapboarding.

The center section, a whitewashed stuccoed random stone section, was next oldest section of the house definite predating 1840.

A two story two bay wide addition extended north of the stone section of the building.

The Yellow Springs Post Office building, originally built as a private residence by C. Nusz, was used as the post office and general store from 1884 until the 1960's.

According to the Directory of Post Offices in Frederick County in 1887:

Tri-weekly mail facilities are furnished to the inhabitants through the Yellow Springs Post Office, which was established in the year 1884. Two stores accommodate the wants of the community with groceries, dry goods, notions, etc. The village contains one blacksmith and wheelwright shop in successful operation . . .

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Yellow Springs Post Office and General Store was destroyed in 1978 and faced the west from the east side of Yellow Springs Road in Yellow Springs.

The two story frame building is six bays wide on the principal facade and was built in three parts. Each part was two bays wide.

The oldest section located on the south end of the building is a log structure with German joints, covered with beaded clapboarding. This part of the building is constructed on a low random stone foundation directly on large stone boulders. A replaced plain recessed four panel door is located in the sixth bay. A replaced 2/2 window is located in the fifth bay.

The center section of the building appears to be the next oldest section of the house definitely predating 1840. This section, a whitewashed stuccoed random stone section, was two bays wide. A recessed entrance with replaced board and batten door is located in the fourth bay. A plain 2/2 window was located in the third bay. Two clerestory windows are located over the third and fourth bays on the second level. A one story shed roofed frame porch supported by five turned columns with poured concrete floor extended across the front of the building between the second and last bay.

A two story two bay wide addition extended north of the stone section of the building. This section, which was two bays wide, had an entrance now boarded shut in the second bay. A double hung 2/2 window was located in the first bay on the first level. Two square two pane windows were located on the second level of the building.

The entire structure which was built on a low random stone foundation was covered by a corrugated tin flank gable roof. Two brick chimneys which were repointed, were located on the south gable end and north center end.

A two story frame addition extends to the rear of the center part of the main block of the building. The addition is three bays deep and abuts a one story frame summer kitchen building. This building, a small two bay wide frame building covered with German siding, is attached to a large shouldered random stone chimney with brick cap. The summer kitchen building is built on a low random stone foundation.


