The Grafton Fout House is an ell shaped two story stretcher bond brick residence five bays wide. The main entrance, a very unusual six panel hinged twin door with carved symmetrically designed center panels, is located in the third bay. All remaining bays are occupied by wood lintels with symmetrical corner blocks.

A two story brick addition, three bays wide with a two story open porch, is located to the rear of the house.

A brick outbuilding used as a smokehouse is located immediately behind the main residence. Also located on the premises is a frame bank barn with very decorative tin roof vents and a frame wagon shed.

The Grafton Fout House was built as indicated by the cornerstone on October 8, 1848. The land and "plantation whereon I now reside," was willed to Grafton by his father, Baltzer on April 2, 1839. The land was initially purchased by Baltzer Fout from Jacob Beard in 1811.

The history of the property is closely related to that of the Lewis Fout Farm located immediately south of the property.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Grafton Fout House is an ell shaped two story stretcher bond brick residence which faces east from the west side of New Design Road.

The principal facade is five bays wide. The main entrance, a very unusual six panel hinged twin door is located in the third bay. The center panels are carved in a symmetrical design. The entrance is surrounded by recessed paneling with a four light transom and wood lintel with circular corner blocks.

Occupying the remaining bays are double hung 6/6 windows with wood lintels with symmetrical corner blocks. The lintel in the first bay on the first level has been replaced. A one bay wide frame porch with decorative brackets is located in the third bay on the first level.

A two story brick addition, three bays wide, with a two story open porch is located to the rear of the house. Six entrances are located on both levels of the porch.

The entire building is built on a low random stone foundation. In the northeast corner is a cornerstone with the words, "Built October 8, 1848 by Grafton Fout" engraved on it.

The standing seam tin flank gable roof with decorative snow steps is connected to the building by a stepped brick cornice.

A brick outbuilding used as a smokehouse is located immediately behind the main residence. Also located on the premises is a frame bank barn with very decorative tin roof vents and a frame wagon shed.

SPECIFIC DATES October 8, 1848 BUILDER/ARCHITECT Grafton Fout

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Grafton Fout House, a brick farmhouse of very typical regional style was built as indicated in the cornerstone on October 8, 1848. The land and "plantation whereon I now reside," was willed to Grafton by his father, Baltzer in April 2, 1839.¹ It is not clear what building he was referring to in this will. However, the land was initially purchased by Baltzer Fout from Jacob Beard in 1811.²

Grafton Fout lived in the house which he built until his death on July 1880 at which time he left the property to his wife, Laura C. Fout, until her death at which time the land reverted to their daughter, Isadora Virginia Wright.³ Wright died intestate in 1905 and upon direction from Equity court the land was sold at public sale. Jefferson Patterson purchased the land in 1935 and has owned it since that time.⁴

The history of the property is closely related to that of the Lewis Fout Farm located immediately south of the property.


