The D. Milton Culler House is significant to the Feagaville area as a Culler residence and Carpenter Gothic residence with original porch, interior trimwork intact and unusual hipped roof.

The D. Milton Culler House is built on land which was granted to the Culler family as early as the late eighteenth century. A farm known as Fielderea Manor consisting of one hundred, seventy-three acres incorporated the land on which the house is set.

However, it is not likely that the existing house was built before 1883 when D. Milton Culler purchased the land for \$10,426.05 from Anna Marie Culler.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The D. Milton Culler House is a two and one-half story hip roofed rectangular frame building covered with asbestos siding which faces west from the east side of Feagaville Lane.

The principal facade is five bays wide. The main entrance is a four panel door with upper arched panels, wood trim with slanted scoring and roundel decoration. Scrolled brackets separate the panes of a three light transom. Flanking either side of the door are two side lights with inset paneling.

Occupying the remaining bays on the first and second level are original two/two windows with louvered shutters. A small Victorian Gothic two/two window is set into the front center gable of the building.

A very decorative frame porch extends between the first and fifth bays on the first level. The tin hip roofed porch is supported by four full boxed columns and two half columns. Each column is decorated by scrolled brackets with scallop trim and dropped pendants in between each column.

The main block is three bays deep. Two/two windows with louvered shutters occupy each bay on the first and second level.

The rear of the building is five bays wide. A rear entrance with one light transom is located in the second bay on the first level. Occupying the first and third bays on the first level and all but the third bay on the second level are two/two windows flanked by louvered shutters.

A rear porch entrance with one light transom is located in the third bay on the second level. A small two/two Victorian Gothic window is located in the center of the rear gable. A frame two story porch with beveled columns and replaced wood railing extends between the first and fifth bays. The porch has been partially enclosed in the northeast corner.

A one story three bay wide wood sided addition made in 1963 extends from the north side of the house. The residence is built on a whitewashed random stone foundation. The house is covered by a replaced tin hipped roof. Two corbeled brick chimneys rise from the north and south center of the building.

Many interior features including corner molding and turned newel post and staircase remain intact.

A small frame barn with tin roof and rubble stone foundation stands just east of the main house. A smokehouse covered with wood shingles and German siding is located next to the barn.


