According to Williams' History of Frederick County Maryland, "the Mount Zion Church (Union) was built in 1819 during the pastorate of Reverend D. F. Schaeffer, D. D. of Frederick. The Lutheran and Reformed people united in this building. It was a very substantial stone structure, and as before mentioned, became a part of Jefferson Charge in 1838.

In the 1880's the Lutherans bought out the Reformed interest and built a new church, Mount Zion, costing \$1800.00, on the site of the first church.

The building served as a church until 1950 when the congregation sold the building to Harry and Marry Feaga for \$2200.00.

Originally the porch accommodated a frame belfry tower with arched openings and slate covered spire. Stained glass Gothic windows occupied each bay.

The building was converted to apartments after being sold in 1950 and was substantially changed for this use.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Old Mount Zion Church is a two story rectangular gable roofed frame building which faces north from the south side of Jefferson Pike.

The principal facade is three bays wide. The main entrance is located in the second bay in an enclosed entrance porch covered with German siding with decorative corner boards. The porch is covered with an asphalt gable roof with plain boxed cornice and dentiled frieze. Originally the porch accommodated a frame belfry tower with arched openings and slate covered spire. The main entrance is a Gothic opening bordered with round molding. Original twin arched panel doors with egg molding cornice and triangular transom is centered in the front of the entrance. Located on either side of the entrance porch are double hung 4/4 windows in Gothic openings with triangular transom lights which have been painted.

Occupying the first and third bays are small 2/2 windows on the first and second levels which replaced original Gothic stained glass windows. The building is four bays deep with small 2/2 windows occupying each bay on the first and second level. Stained glass Gothic windows originally occupied each bay.

The rear of the building has been substantially changed by the addition of a two story open porch and numerous rear windows and entrances.

The entire structure is built on a low random stone foundation and is covered with German siding and a standing seam tin roof with replaced plain boxed cornice with return. A single brick chimney rises from the west center of the building. A cornerstone in the northeast corner of the building states "Mt. Zion 1880."

The building was converted to apartments after being sold in 1950 and was substantially changed for this use.
