The H. Stimmel House is primarily significant to the area as a simple log dwelling covered by original beaded siding which has remained intact despite changes to the interior of the house.

The earliest documented date for the building is 1858 when the bond map indicates it as the home of H. Stimmel. The house was located along the Frederick and Emmitsburg Turnpike at the time. A tollhouse for the turnpike was located just a quarter mile south of the house and across the road.

The building has had numerous owners during its history, the most important of which was Dr. Thomas E. R. Miller who was a prominent physician in Frederick County during the late nineteenth century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The H. Stimmel House is a one story log structure covered with clapboard-
ing and asbestos which faces east from the west side of Lewistown Road.

The principal facade is four bays wide. Two main entrances are located
in the second and fourth bays. Both are replaced doors. Located in the
second bay is a replaced four panel door. Located in the fourth bay is
a modern French door.

Occupying the remaining bays are original double hung 6/6 windows. The
main block of the building is two bays wide.

A one story frame kitchen addition is located to the rear of the main
block.

The entire house is constructed on a low random stone foundation and is
covered by a replaced asbestos roof with open rafters.

The log structure is covered by its original hand split clapboarding with
fine beading along each board's lower edge.

The owner is in the process of rehabilitating the house and is expected
to remove the asbestos.


