C. 1849

The Brice Glissan House is a small stone house, one room deep and two bays wide. Located to the rear of the main block is a one and two story frame addition covered with aluminum siding; built in the second half of the nineteenth century and added on to in the twentieth century.

The interior of the main block of the house is a very simple one room design with original flooring, plain baseboards and a small tight winder staircase.

The house is substantially smaller than most of the stone residences in the New Market area with only one room on each floor excluding the later addition. An unusual feature of the house is an original drawer inset under the deep windowsill on the second floor. This house is one of three residences in the New Market area with inset window drawers.

It is believed that Brice Glissan, a carpenter, built the house in 1849 as indicated by a signature of a workman "Jacob Sponsellar 1849."

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Brice Glissan House is a small two and a half story gable roofed random stone residence banked against a hill on the east side of Route #75 south of Libertytown.

The main block of the house is two bays wide and one room deep. The main entrance, an eight panel door with wood lintel, is located in the first bay on the second level. A double hung 6/6 window with wood lintel occupies the second bay on both the first and second level. A converted Victorian paneled and glass door is located in the first bay on the first level. Spanning across the front of the residence is a modern two story frame porch which has been enclosed on the first level. An exterior stone and brick chimney is located on the exterior of the south gable wall.

The interior of the main block of the house is a very simple one room design with original flooring, plain baseboards and a small tight staircase located in the northwest corner which connects the different levels. An unusual feature of the house is an original drawer inset under the deep windowsill on the second level. This house is one of three residences in the New Market area with inset window drawers. The inside of the drawer is marked "Jacob Sponseller, 1849."

Located to the rear of the main block is a one and two story frame addition covered with aluminum siding; built in the second half of the nineteenth century and added on to in the twentieth century. The entire structure is banked against a hill and built on a random stone foundation which accommodates a full basement in the rear addition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Brice Glissan House is a small stone house with interior woodwork which is characteristic of many residences in the New Market area by trade. It is believed that Brice Glissan, a carpenter, built the house in 1849 as indicated by a signature of a workman "Jacob Sponsellar 1849" in a window drawer on the second level.

The house is substantially smaller than most of the stone residences in the New Market area with only one room on each floor excluding the later addition. The use of window drawers has only been found in the New Market area during the survey and it is unknown what influenced their design.


