1879

The Dorsey Methodist Church is a one and a half story frame gable roofed church building, three bays wide by three bays long with a small semicircular window located over the main entrance. A graveyard is located west of the church building.

The Dorsey Methodist Church, previously known as the New London Church was built in 1879 as indicated by the cornerstone. The land was donated by Margaret H. Harding in a deed to the trustees of the church on June 14, 1879, stating "that they shall erect and build or cause to be erected and built thereon a house or place of worship." On February 15, 1908, the church was sold at a cost of \$350.00 to Walter J. Forsett et al, the trustees of a Black congregation.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Dorsey Methodist Church is a one-and-a-half story frame gable roofed church building, three bays wide by three bays long, which faces north from the south side of Lime Plant Road. A small, enclosed, gabled roofed entrance porch occupies the second bay on the north side over which is located a small semi-circular window. Double hung 4/4 windows with louvered shutters occupy the remaining bays on the north side and the three bays on the east and west side. The entire structure is built on a low random stone foundation; a boxed cornice with return finishes a tin roof. A cornerstone in the foundation states "M.E. Church 1879." A graveyard is located west of the church building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Dorsey United Methodist Church, previously known as the New London Church, was built in 1879. The land was donated by Margaret E. Harding in a deed to the trustees of the church on June 14, 1879, stating "that they shall erect and build or caused to be erected and built thereon a house or place of worship." ¹ The trustees represented were John Danner, Andrew W. Barber, Jonathan R. Cronise, Jacob Keller and Samuel A. Lowe.

On February 15, 1908 the church was sold at a cost of \$350 to Walter J. Forsett, et al, the trustees of a black congregation.

According to older members of the present congregation, Reverend William Kent was the first minister of this church.

Weekly Methodist services are still held in the building.


