STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to Paul Wilson, this house was occupied by Charles and Laura Proctor. The deed for the land was never registered in the names of either, so it has not been possible to determine the dates of their occupancy beyond the time that Wilson remembers, which was the second quarter of the 20th century. Since the house is no longer standing and has been torn down, there is no deed, so no date for the construction of the house can be established. Perhaps it was built in the last quarter of the 19th century, as the same as the other log houses of the descendants of David Moody, William Proctor and John H. Beall.

MT EPHRAIM COMMUNITY, c. 1900-1925


