This two story log house was the home of one of the grandchildren of a principal founder of the Black community in Mt. Ephraim. Like other log houses in the area, it contained two rooms down and two up. It was built on a parcel of land bequeathed to the descendant and resembled the homes built by other descendants on their land.

Though this house is no longer standing, it is remembered by Paul Wilson, the grandson of Bene Hallman and great nephew of James and Malinda Hallman. According to him, the house stood near the site of his present-day garden, about 75 yards in front (east) of his house. According to Wilson the house was built of logs, and resembled the house of his grandparents. "All of the old-time log houses were built more or less alike", he recalls. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to Paul Wilson, this house was occupied by James and Malinda Hallman, James being the grandson of John H. Beall. The house stood on a three acre parcel that was a portion of the 12 acre tract that John H. Beall purchased from Ephraim Harris in 1883 (deed AF 7/513). In his will, C.E.S. 1/561, John Beall divided his property into four parcels which he devised to his four grandchildren.

According to the 1900 U.S. Census for Frederick County, James Hallman was living with his grandfather "John H. Bell" at the time and was born in 1868. According to Paul Wilson, James and his wife Malinda had no children.
