The Mullican Log House was built about 1855 with an nearby log smokehouse of the same date, possibly by Thomas Mullican who sold the property in 1886 to George T. Mullican (1850-1922). The house has german siding and a center entrance with a one-story porch. A 1964 one-story addition on the south gable end also has german siding. Another shed addition covers most of the rear or east elevation and the north elevation. The smokehouse has weathered whitewashed walls with an extended gable roof over the entrance. The log house is a fair example of the mid-19th century vernacular dwelling, although altered in the early and mid 20th century. The smokehouse is a good example of the type, the major exterior change being the replacement of its original roof with composition material.

The Mullican Log House is a two-story log dwelling with german siding built about 1855 with an adjacent exposed log smokehouse of about the same date located on the east side of Thurston Road about 50 yards north of the intersection of Sugarloaf Mountain Road near Urbana, Frederick County, Maryland. The house faces west and the smokehouse is located near the southeast corner of the dwelling. The dating of the structures is based on land records and architectural details.

The dwelling has three bays on the first story and two on the second, with a shed-roofed porch sheltering the entrance in the center bay. The windows have 6/6 sash with plain architraves. The roof is covered with composition material and an exterior brick chimney is located on the south gable end, with its base enclosed by a one-story addition built in 1964. Both the south gable end and the addition are covered with german siding. The north elevation is covered with vinyl siding and has 2/2 sash on the first story. A one-story shed addition extends across the east elevation and onto the north elevation. The addition also has vinyl siding. A single-pane square window is located in the second story of the north gable.

Smokehouse: The log smokehouse has a weathered whitewashed finish and an extended gable roof over the entrance on the north end. The roof is covered with composition material and the gable is faced with weatherboards. The smokehouse was probably built at about the same time as the dwelling, about 1855. It is currently used as a storage shed.

The Mullican Log House is minimally significant for its architecture, being a fair example of a vernacular dwelling of the mid-19th century. It retains some of its german siding and the general appearance of a simple rural farmhouse of the period. The log smokehouse is a good example of the type, the only major exterior change having been the replacement of the roof with modern materials. The original roof was probably wood shingles. The house was extant at least by 1886 when George T. Mullican (1850-1922) purchased a 1-acre lot "with improvements" for \$1 from Thomas and Mary E. Mullican, probably his parents. Its design, scale, and materials, and those of the smokehouse, strongly indicate that the buildings were erected prior to 1860, perhaps in 1855 when Thomas Mullican bought 14-3/4 acres from Isaac Davis. In 1889, Thomas sold this tract to George who retained the approximately 15-acre farm until 1908, selling it to Nigel D. McElfresh (1867-1934), who owned it until 1931.


