DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Pleasant Grove Church is a rectangular one-and-a-half story shallow gable roofed frame building which faces from the east side of Route 75.

It is a functioning church which is unrelated to any other buildings, but is surrounded on the south and east side by a cemetery enclosed in an ornate cast iron fence.

The principle facade is three bays wide, the main entrance door which is a replaced five panel double door with segmented stained glass transom is located in the second bay. Two double hung segmented stained glass windows with plain trim occupy the first and third bays. A three bay wide eight step wooden front porch with railing extends from the east side of the building. The replaced asphalt roof is finished by a boxed cornice. The main chancel is built on a low random stone foundation.

The north and south sides of the building are identical - each three bays wide with double hung segmented stained glass windows with plain trim.

A modern cinder block addition extends from the west and northwest of the building.







Section 7:

Updated architectural information:

On October 18, 1993, photos were taken of the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church, showing the following exterior changes: vinyl siding; a one-story frame enclosure projecting from the northwest elevation, forming a foyer over the principal entrance; the sign panel above the foyer, which read Pleasant Grove U.M. Church 1867-1903, now includes the date 1981, undoubtedly the date the foyer was added. All other exterior architectural description remains as in the 1977 inventory form.

Section 8:

The church is minimally significant for its architecture, illustrating the general rectangular form of its original design, although now altered by the 1981 foyer and vinyl siding.
