The Mount Pleasant United Methodist Church is a one and one-half story front gable roofed rectangular brick building laid in common bond.

The main entrance is twin arched panel doors with original hardware, single stone doorstep, purple marbled glass fanlight transom, and arched double header brick lintel.

Located in the southeast corner of the building is a cornerstone which states "M.E. CHURCH 1870." A frame belfry tower straddles the gable on the south side. The original bell remains intact behind a turned railing with arched openings, dentiled cornice and brackets. The steep pyramidal roof is covered with tin and a weather vane extends from the top of the tower.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Mount Pleasant United Methodist Church is a one and half story front gable roofed rectangular brick building laid in common bond with modern addition which faces south from the north side of Route 26 in Mount Pleasant.

The principle facade of the building is three bays wide. The main entrance, twin arched panel doors with original hardware, single stone doorstep, purple marbled glass fanlight transom and arched double header brick lintel is located in the second bay.

Occupying the remaining bays on the first level are arched double hung 9/9 marbled stained glass purple windows with architrave trim and protruding double header arches. Shutters are missing from the windows. A wood fan vent with double header lintel is located in the front gable of the building.

The brickwork in each corner of the building on the facade extends forward of the main block. The entire structure is built on a low coursed quarried stone foundation. Located in the southeast corner of the building is a cornerstone which indicates "M. E. Church 1870." Unfortunately the entire structure was sandblasted and repointed with portland cement in the past five years.

The building extends four bays in length. Occupying each bay on the east and west sides are stained glass double hung 9/9 windows with wood lintels. A one story brick addition extends to the rear of the building on the north side.

The entire building is covered by a standing seam tin roof attached by a plain boxed cornice with frieze and return on the gable ends of the building and stepped brick cornice on the east and west sides.

A frame belfry tower straddles the gable on the south side. The original bell remains intact behind a turned railing with arched openings, dentiled cornice and brackets. The steep pyramidal roof is covered with tin and a weather vane extends from the top of the tower.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The erection of the Mount Pleasant United Methodist Church in 1870 reflected the growth of the Mount Pleasant community and of the Methodist congregation from its earliest days in the Methodist meetinghouse of Israel's Creek. The land the church was built on was obtained from William and Sarah McDannell, one time owners of the front parcel of land now belonging to Glade Valley Farms, Inc.

The Mount Pleasant United Methodist Church counted among its members and trustees some of the most distinguished citizens of the post war Mount Pleasant area. The building itself is significant for its historical/religious background and because of its distinctive purple marbled windows, all of which are original.


