DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#7 is a tall, 2-1/2 story detached brick house, three bays wide and two in depth with a two story, brick "L" shaped wing, two bays wide and five bays in depth with a newer balcony on the rear of the front section and a one story, brick one bay square dependency. This house was built over a one story fieldstone building according to sidewall evidence, and brickwork is in common bond. The front entrance-way occupies the left (W) bay with a newer door, granite sill, and segmental arched overlight, the whole being framed by a newer, moulded, protruding architrave. All front windows are of 6/6 sash with flat brick arches of shaped voussoirs and mostly 6/1 sash with wood lintels and sills on the rear area. The attic is well lighted by two 6/6 sash windows in the left gable and one 6/6 sash in the right gable. The front section has a steep sloped, "A" frame roof of slate with double enclosed chimneys rising from each end. The wing has a metal shed roof. The front roofline is decorated by a Victorian boxed cornice with dentils and a band of cut and pierced motifs across the frieze. The end brackets are adorned with crockets bearing moulded lion heads of brass or copper but now painted over. This house sets on a very high fieldstone foundation. There is a wingside, rear, paved dooryard patio.
