**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

#23 is an old, 2-1/2 story frame detached house, three bays wide and two deep with a one story, brick "L" shaped wing and a one bay square newer brick extension. The front is covered by clapboarding, the right side with tar paper and the left side by board and batten. An old, four panel door occupies the off-centered, middle bay and is approached by a high wooden porch. The front windows are 2/2 sash and rear area windows are of 6/6 sash. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with a central chimney, and the wings have shed roofs, all of metal. This house sets on a high fieldstone foundation. Cellar rafters are hand hewn and rounded. It is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement.
