DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a pair of detached, two story, tall frame houses, four bays wide and deep with a two story, frame "T" shaped wing, two bays deep and three bays wide with end balconies. #45 probably retains the original appearance with the front facade covered by wood siding grooved into blocks with protruding wood block quoins on the left corner giving a stone-like appearance and similar to a house on the 300 block of W. Patrick Street. The left and rear side is covered by clapboarding. #47 is now sheathed in composition siding. Simple front entranceways occupy the end bays with four panel doors and narrow overlights. These are approached by five and six step block porches. All windows are of 2/2 sash and there are also four panel doors on the rear. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a low "A" frame and both are of metal. The front roofline has a moulded box cornice with the frieze decorated by dentils and bands of scallops. Small moulded brackets accent the bays. This building sets on a high brick and cement faced foundation. It is fronted by a herringbone patterned brick pavement. There are flower yards to the rear.
