DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached row of three, 1-1/2 story brick houses, six bays wide and two in depth. #101 has a newer brick, two story, full-width wing with a shed roof sloping to the side and with a rear balcony. The front facade is laid in Flemish bond and all other brickwork is in common bond. The simple front entrances occupy the right bay of #101 and the left bays of the other houses with #101 and 105 having newer doors and #103 retaining an old, four panel door with top panels now in glass. Both #103 and 105 retain original, four pane overlights. These are all approached by high, five step porches. #101 now has a 2/2 sash window on the front with 6/6 sash in the wing. The other houses retain old, narrow, 9/6 colonial sash on the front and all have wood lintels and sills. The attic of #103 is lighted by an off-centered, 6/6 vertical casement dormer window on the rear slope. The windows in the end gables are newer. The building has a steep sloped "A" frame roof now covered with tar paper, and the roof rests on two string brick cornices. There are small enclosed chimneys at each end and to the right side of #103. The building sets on a high fieldstone foundation. It is fronted by a brick pavement with #105 being laid in colonial hexagon shaped bricks.
