DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#107 is a 1-1/2 story log house (exposed on left side), detached and three bays wide and two in depth with a 1-1/2 story frame "L" shaped wing, one bay wide and two in depth with a one story frame extension. The front facade and side gables are now clapboarded with the first floor of the sides being stuccoed. The wing is sheathed with narrow, colonial type wood siding. An old, six panel colonial style door occupies the right (E) bay. Front windows are of small, 6/6 sash as on the first floor of the wing. The top section of the wing is lighted by small, 4+4 sliding "lie on your stomach" casement windows. The front attic contains two small, four pane windows in the left gable and a 2/2 sash in the right gable. The front section has a steep sloped "A" frame roof covered with asbestos shingles and a small enclosed chimney rises on the left side. The wing has a metal shed roof. The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation and is fronted by a brick pavement.
