DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Rosenour Building is a three story structure with a flat roof. It is constructed of red brick laid in common bond with dark brownstone trim. It is four bays wide, each bay being topped with an arch. Around the jambs of the windows and carrying on up around the arch in each bay is a brick moulding.

The first floor has a metal and glass storefront and signplate. This consists of two large display windows to each side of the entrance.

On the second story there is one window in each of the four bays. The windows are double hung with 1/1 sash. The sills of all the windows at this level is a course of brownstone which is continuous across the whole facade of the building. There is a similar stone band for the window lintels. Above these lintels is a brick panel in each bay. This is bordered by a course of brick with every other brick raised.

There is also a solid stone band running across the whole front serving as the sills for the third story windows. These windows are double hung with 1/1 sash, but the top sash is rounded at the head following the arch and is fixed. The key blocks in the brick arch are brownstone consoles.

Above the keystones is a stone moulding over which the sign with the building's name is placed in the masonry. Over the sign is a wood cornice featuring heavy square wood modillions and an egg and dark moulding below. At either end of the cornice are terminating brackets, each supported on two consoles. These brackets have a lion's head mask on them. On either front corner are small chimney-like objects projecting above the roof about three ft.
