DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a 2-1/2 story, detached frame pair of houses, four bays wide and two in depth with a two story, frame "T" shaped wing, three bays wide and two deep with side balconies and a one story, frame extension. #31 has the original sheathing of wood siding grooved into blocks with superimposed blocks on the end corner representing stone quoins. The exposed side is of clapboarding. #33 is now sheathed in new aluminum siding. Newer doors with narrow, one pane overlights occupy the outer bays and are 6' above pavement level, reached by high porches. All house windows are of 2/2 sash except the twelve pane sash lighting the fronts of the cellars and small, four pane windows in the gable of each attic. The front section has a moderate slope "A" frame roof with a small chimney rising from the center of the ridge and the wing. The wing has a rather flat roof and both are of metal. The front roofline has a boxed cornice with dentil trim. The building sets on a high fieldstone foundation.
