

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

#100 is an unusually shaped, 2-1/2 story detached brick house, two bays wide and six bays in depth with a one bay wide, two bay deep pedimented wing centered on the left (E) side. Newer brick or frame, one story extensions to the left of the front facade, the left side and rear make the present plan rectangular in shape. A side balcony projects from the rear of the left side. The centered pediment on the left side\* may have originally been the main entrance. All brickwork is in common bond. Considering the newer, one story front extension, a newer doorway now occupies the center bay with newer, double sets of 6/6 sash windows on either side. On the second floor front are two 2/2 sash windows with brick segmental arches. Other house windows are also of 2/2 sash but with wood lintels and sills. The attic is lighted by a round arched 2/2 sash window in the front and left side gables and a small, four pane sash in the rear gable. The three section roof is of steep "A" frame construction covered by lozenge-shaped asbestos type tiles. Small chimneys rise from the ridge on the front section and at the rear gable. The roof overhangs all sides of the building including the three gables which are decorated with cornice returns and crowned by turned finials. The house rests on a low fieldstone foundation.

\*Note: According to a longtime neighbor, the main entrance had originally been on the left side.
