DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached, 2-1/2 story frame pair of houses, six bays wide and approximately three in depth with one story, one bay square rear frame extensions. The building is sheathed with clapboarding. Front entrances occupy the outer bays and #125 retains a small covered porch with turned pillars. All front windows are now of 1/1 sash but rear and side windows retain 6/6 sash with louvered shutters. Centered above the front facade of each house is a large pediment containing a small, round arched window lighting the attic. The building has a moderate slope metal "A" frame roof with the front pediments having steep slopes. A square chimney set at an angle rises from the center of the ridge. The front roofline, front and side gables are ornamented with small, Victorian-cut brackets with turned pendants. The building sets on a rather high fieldstone foundation and the cellar walls on each side contain small windows with cast iron grills ornamented by three dimensional cherub heads made at the local "American Foundry."
