DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached, three section house at the end of a long driveway. The original section is a 2-1/2 story, brick, Federal house, two bays wide and one in depth of common bond. A newer glass over panels door occupies the left (W) bay and is protected by a Victorian pent roof canopy. The windows are of 2/2 and 6/6 sash with wood lintels and sills. The Victorian, rear frame addition is of 2-1/2 stories, three bays wide and approximately five in depth, extending 1/2 bay to the left of the front section and with a one story, frame side extension. The first floor is sheathed by wood siding grooved to resemble stone blocks and the second story has clapboarding. There is a newer side door and windows are of 6/6 sash. The 2-1/2 story, frame east addition extends from the right rear corner of the front section and is approximately three bays wide and two in depth. The first floor is also sheathed in "wood blocks" on the first floor front with the area above by shingles with ornamental bands of round ended, concave and convex shingles. Aluminum siding now covers the sidewall. A newer front door occupies the left bay and is protected by a front porch with a cornice and frieze decorated with roundels and chevrons. A bay window is set to the left of the front door. All windows are of 1/1 sash. All three sections have moderate slope "A" frame roofs, the first section rests on two string brick cornices and the rear section roof extends to and above the front section ridge with the gable trimmed by scalloped barge boards. The right side end of the east addition also has Victorian decor at the top of the gables. All sections have small chimneys. The sections have low foundations with the front section resting on fieldstone.
