DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a detached, two story pair of frame houses, four bays wide and three in depth with a two story, frame "T" shaped wing, three bays wide and four in depth with side balconies enclosed on #209. This house has been completely sheathed with aluminum siding while #211 is covered by asphalt shingles on the front, original clapboards on the exposed side and asbestos shingles on the rear. Front entrances occupy the outer bays and #209 has a newer door and a newer pair of windows to the right. Both houses have 1/1 sash on the front of the first floor, 2/2 sash above and mostly 6/6 sash windows on the rear area. All front windows and doors originally were decorated with small, ^{rather} flat Victorian pediments trimmed with a roundel and a band of scallops but have been removed from the first floor of #209. The front section roof slopes to the rear and the wing has a rather flat, "A" frame roof. The front facade is headed by a richly ornamented, Victorian cornice and frieze with bands of dentils and pointed panels with a narrow band of chevrons. Centered on the frieze of each house is a small pediment with the same decor. Channeled brackets end the cornice and center pediments. The building rests on a low fieldstone foundation.
