Description of Physical Appearance: 110 North Market Street is a late nineteenth century commercial structure, three stories high, four bays wide constructed of brick laid in a common bond pattern. The building is an integral part of the other commercial buildings surrounding it in size, scale, set back, and in that it is connected to the buildings on either side. The first floor of the building was changed by the 1950's by the application of corrugated tin over the brick on the front and the introduction of large recessed show windows. An entrance giving access to the upstairs apartments is also located on the first level in the first bay from the north end of the building. The first floor interior of the building has been altered many times and retains little if any original or significant historic architectural materials.

The second story of the building appears taller than the remaining two floors because of the original four 9/9 windows with wrought iron balconies which remain intact. The four original 6/6 windows are still located on the third level of the building. All the windows are capped by hooded wooden cornices supported by cut brackets.

A large overhanging wooden cornice with dentil molding and scrolled bracket supports connected by a horizontal wood molding at the base is located at the top of the building which is covered by a flat roof which gently slopes to the rear of the building.

Statement of Significance: 110 North Market Street is significant to the Frederick Historic District as a late 19th century commercial building which has retained much of its original architectural details and is a contributing part of the primarily late nineteenth century commercial district of Frederick. The 9/9 windows and ornate hood molding are particularly important features of the building. Historically, it is believed that the second floor of the building was used as a meeting room for groups in the community.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The building at No. 110 N. Market Street is three stories high and four bays wide. Its materials are brick painted yellow and wood trim painted dark brown. Covering it is a flat roof.

At the first floor level is a metal and glass storefront and signplate. To the north is an opening in the wall allowing access to the upper floors.

The second floor windows are of double hung 9/2 sash. Their sills are wood and over each window is a small wood denticulated cornice supported on both ends by a console. In front of the bottom-most quarter of the window and attached to the wall are iron grilles.

The third floor windows are similar to those below but with 6/6 sash and without grilles. At the top of the wall is the entablature; this is composed of a small wood architrave, a brick frieze, and a wood cornice with large dentils. The whole order is supported on twelve wood brackets. The entablature has a 2' return at the southwest corner of the building.
