DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#115 is a detached, 2-1/2 story brick house, five bays wide and two in depth with a large, brick pediment centered on the front and a large, 2-1/2 story brick "T" shaped wing, three bays wide and four in depth with side balconies having Victorian-cut banisters and the building is ended by a four bay wide section, one bay deep. The walls are of an unpainted light red brick in common bond. The front entranceway occupies the center bay and is of three parts with a four panel door with top panels rounded, sidelights with dentil trim, and a three part transom. All front section windows are of 2/2 sash with segmental brick arches with infills incised with scrolls, as above the front door. The entranceway is protected by a Victorian covered porch with turned pillars, a spindle cornice and ornate cut brackets, as on #109. Side attic and front pediment windows have diagonal-shaped tops to fit the gabled roof lines. The wing area also has 2/2 sash but with wood lintels and sills. There are six panel Colonial doors with transoms on the wing. Both the front and wing sections have steep slope, metal "A" frame roofs with overhangs, and the front cornice is trimmed by mouldings. Double flue enclosed chimneys rise at both front section and wing gables and at the center of the wing. This mansion rests on a low fieldstone foundation. It sets back from the street and is reached by old Colonial, hexagon brick paths.
