**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

#201 is a 2-1/2 story, detached brick house with a centered front pediment, three bays wide and two bays in depth with a two story, original brick "L" shaped wing, two bays in depth and 1-1/2 bays wide. A newer side extension makes this now full width. All brickwork is in painted common bond. The front entrance occupies the left bay with double doors of panels and is headed by a wide, segmental arched transom. The first floor is fronted by a covered porch supported by turned pillars and ornate, Victorian-cut brackets. All older house windows are of 1/1 sash with two row header brick segmental arches decorated by roundels in the infills, as above the front door. The attic is lighted by a small, four pane window in each gable and by a 1/1 sash in the front pediment. The front section has a steep slope, slate "A" frame roof with a small enclosed chimney at each end. The wing has a rather flat roof. This house rests on a low fieldstone foundation and sets back from the pavement.
