DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

#207 appears to be a shack due to commercial alterations and neglect, but on close inspection retains many of its attractive features of its former use as a residence. It is a detached, 2-1/2 story, frame house with a centered pedimented dormer window on the front facade. It is three bays wide and two in depth with a full-width, 2-1/2 story frame wing extending one bay to the right (E) side. It is now sheathed with asbestos siding. The front doorway occupies the left bay with a newer glass/panels door, a two pane overlight and a dentiled transom bar. All house windows are of 2/2 sash set in unusual round, moulded frames. The attic is lighted by a small, six pane window in each gable and by a small window in the front pediment. The front section has a steep slope, "A" frame roof with the steep-sloped, pedimented dormer on the front, which is decorated in the half-timbered style. Small chimneys rise from each end. The wing has a broad, moderate slope, "A" frame roof, and both are of slate. The front cornice and frieze is of a concave shape with Victorian-cut end brackets bearing turned pendants. The house sets on a rather high fieldstone foundation.
