
**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a simple colonial styled building built of stone. It is 2-1/2 stories in height. The stone is painted gray on the front but on the sides it is exposed. On the first floor are two metal and glass storefronts separated by a doorway with a segmental arch over it. The door itself is modern.

The second floor has five wood double hung windows. These have 6/6 sash and wood sills. The structure has a typical colonial wood cornice with very simple console modillions.

The roof is gable with the ridge paralleling Market Street. At either end of the building is brick chimneys.

Following is an elevation of the original facade. Mr. William H. Kline had a "Green grocery" in the south half & there was a barber shop in the north half, with Mr. Kline & family living upstairs - typical of the period.



Curb consisted of angular stone slabs & street was of cobblestones

To the n. of it was an open alley for wagons & a 2 1/2 story brick house
